There are 4 big things we want to get right.



We will make it easier for people with disability


- to visit police stations



We will


 help our police and staff understand the needs of people with disability

We want our staff with disability to know


- we support them

- get a different job at Victoria Police.


We want to teach all our staff how to support people with disability.

- reasonable adjustments.


A reasonable adjustment is where we change things to support a person with disability to work.
