

Acoustic Neuroma

AKA vestibular schwannoma, acoustic neurinoma, acoustic neurilemoma

Neurologist

Investigations and Reports for Consideration

- Relevant medical records including date of removal of tumour, the neurologic assessment including whether there are any residual neurological deficits
- Treatment type including dates, whether there has been tumour progression

Medical Standard

May be fit for unrestricted duties if all are true:

- The tumour has been completely removed
- At least one year has passed since removal of tumour
- There is little or no residual neurological deficit, as determined by a neurologist
- Any residual neurological deficit does not impair in any way the functional ability to perform the inherent requirements
- At least 36 months has passed post radiotherapy treatment with no tumour progression
- Meets the NTC Fitness to Drive Commercial Drivers Standard.

- Relevant medical records including diagnosis, warning symptoms and effect on functional ability, date of last episode of vestibular dysfunction, whether the symptoms are controlled or abated
- Audiogram
- · Treatment including compliance with treatment

Medical Standard

May be fit for unrestricted duties if all are true:

- Treated
- The person has insight into the impact of their vestibular dysfunction on their driving and the essential functions of the job
- If treated and if has recurrent episodes of vertigo that occur <u>with warning symptoms</u> then all of the following criteria are met:
 - o Warning symptoms do not themselves cause impairment
 - o Warning symptoms are of sufficient duration
 - The unexpected jerking motions that are experienced while performing the role do not lead to impairment.
- If treated and if has recurrent episodes of vertigo that occur <u>without warning</u> symptoms, then all of the following criteria are met:
 - 6 months free of vestibular dysfunction reflecting effective treatment or abatement of episodes

- Able to effectively and safely perform the inherent requirements without exacerbation or aggravation of the condition

- Treated

- Relevant medical records including diagnosis, symptoms and effect on functional ability, date of last episode of vestibular dysfunction, whether the symptoms are controlled or abated
- Functional assessment of ability to drive and perform inherent requirements
- Treatment including compliance with treatment

Medical Standard

May be fit for unrestricted duties if all are true:

- Functional assessment indicates ability required for driving safely and to perform the essential job functions
- Asymptomatic for a minimum of 6 months, symptoms abated
- The person has insight into the impact of their vestibular dysfunction on their driving and the essential functions of the job
- Compliant with treatment
- Able to effectively and safely perform the inherent requirements without exacerbation or aggravation of the condition
- Meets the NTC Fitness to Drive Commercial Drivers Standard.

Otitis Externa / Otitis Media

Investigations and Reports for Consideration

- · Relevant medical records including diagnosis, symptoms
- For otitis externa: effect on functional ability including use of equipment such as earphones or earplugs
- Audiogram
- Treatment including compliance with treatment

Medical Standard

May be fit for unrestricted duties if all are true:

- Condition has resolved with treatment
- Compliant with treatment
- Able to effectively and safely perform the inherent requirements without exacerbation or aggravation of the condition
- Hearing standard is met
- Meets the NTC Fitness to Drive Commercial Drivers Standard.

Ability to hear



Smell Disorders

Includes anosmia (absence of ability to smell), hyposmia (decreased ability to smell) and dysosmia (distortion in perception of smell)

Investigations and Reports for Consideration

• Relevant medical records including diagnosis, symptoms, extent of impact on smell

Medical Standard

May be fit for unrestricted duties if all are true:

- Able to smell hazardous fumes, smoke, drugs, decomposition
- Able to effectively and safely perform the inherent requirements of an operational general police officer and protective services officer without exacerbation or aggravation of the condition.

- Relevant medical records including diagnosis, aetiology, symptoms
- Audiogram

Medical Standard

May be fit for unrestricted duties if all are true:

- Symptoms were due to an acute or benign non-recurring process
- History does not impair ability to effectively and safely perform the inherent requirements of an operational general police officer and protective services officer without exacerbation or aggravation of the condition
- Hearing standard is met
- Meets the NTC Fitness to Drive Commercial Drivers Standard.

Vertigo

Investigations and Reports for Consideration

- Relevant medical records including diagnosis, aetiology, presence of warning symptoms and effect on functional ability and performance of inherent requirements, date of last episode of vestibular dysfunction
- Treatment and compliance with treatment

Medical Standard

May be fit for unrestricted duties if all are true:

- If diagnosis is benign positional vertigo or acute peripheral vestibulopathy if the following criteria are met:
 - o 2 months free of symptoms
 - o Symptoms were due to an acute or benign non-reoccurring process
 - o Symptoms are controlled and abated.
- If recurrent episodes of vertigo that occur <u>with warning symptoms</u> and all of the following criteria are met:
 - Warning symptoms do not impair ability
 - Warning symptoms are of sufficient duration.
- If recurrent episodes of vertigo that occur <u>without warning symptoms</u> and all of the following criteria are met:
 - o 6 months free of symptoms of vestibular dysfunction
 - Symptoms are controlled and abated
 - Warning symptoms do not impair ability
 - Warning symptoms are of sufficient duration.
- The unexpected jerking motions that are experienced while performing the role do not lead to impairment
- The person has insight into the impact of their vestibular dysfunction on their driving and the essential functions of the job
- History does not impair ability to effectively and safely perform the inherent requirements without exacerbation or aggravation of the condition
- Meets the NTC Fitness to Drive Commercial Drivers Standard.

Investigations and Reports for Consideration

- Relevant medical records including diagnosis, aetiology, symptoms, results of complete head and neck evaluation, results of laryngeal evaluations
- Treatment and compliance with treatment

Medical Standard

May be fit for unrestricted duties if all are true:

- Hoarseness resolved
- Aetiology has been determined
- Any resolved hoarseness was due to an acute or benign non-reoccurring process
- Absence of a severe voice disorder
- Malignancy has been excluded
- Ability to effectively and safely perform the inherent requirements without exacerbation or aggravation of the condition
- Meets the NTC Fitness to Drive Commercial Drivers Standard.
